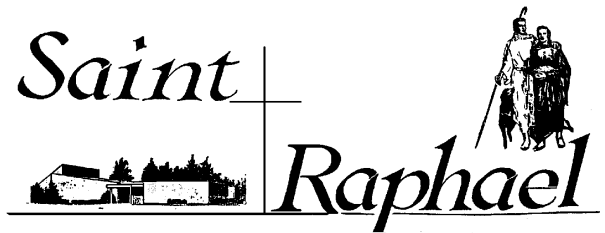

"But to his own disciples he explained everything in private."

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ, I got a new book, "The biggest lie in the history of Christianity" written by Matthew Kelly. I found a very powerful phrase that helps me with my homily for this Sunday. Matthew wrote, "Transforming people one at a time is at the heart of God's plan for the world. It is also essential to developing dynamic marriages, loving families, vibrant Christian communities, thriving businesses and economies, and extraordinary schools and nations. If you get the man right (or the woman, of course), you get the world right."

I think that this is the big intention of our Creator for this world. Every Sunday, God gives us a lot of food, in order that we can be nourished and work every single day in our lives. Every time that you become a better person, better Catholic you are helping our Creator to transform our world. In one of our daily masses, we heard, the gospel where Jesus was asked, what is the great commandment in the law and Jesus replied, "The first is this: Hear, O Israel! The Lord our God is Lord alone! You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength. The second is this: You shall love your neighbor as yourself." I was thinking that we need to start in the opposite side, loving first our self, our neighbor and finally we are going to love our God. But, at the same time God does an important role in this process.

When I read this gospel, this phrase caught my attention, "But to his own disciples he explained everything in private." Jesus was telling the whole world about his Father's kingdom. A wonderful news, a great truth in a very simple language and his has to explain more to his disciples in private. His disciples were people that really want to be with him, they knew that what Jesus was telling in public was a very important thing for their future life and they were ready to listen and understand about what Jesus wants to share with them.

Matthew Kelly asked very important questions in his book like these. Are you willing to let God transform you? Do you believe that are you capable of accomplishing the change? Do you believe that holiness is possible? With these questions he is challenging us to change our world. Matthew says, "It is our own thoughts, words, and actions that are at the epicenter of our circle of influence." And this part of our life only can be change in private with our Creator.

Stewardship Reflections -

"For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each one may receive good or evil, according to what he has done in the body." - 2 CORINTHIANS 5:10

We are all accountable for the gifts God has given us – our time, our talent and our treasure. Each of us is accountable not only for our own life but for the lives of others as well. One day God will ask each of us what did we do with the gifts we were given. How will you respond?
