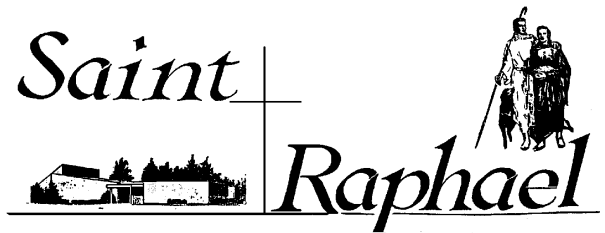

#### **Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time June 5, 2016**

**"He was moved with pity for her and said to her, "Do not weep."**

My dear friends in Christ, we began the ordinary time again! Now we are in the tenth Sunday of Ordinary Time. I was looking at the gospel in this season and I was trying to find a theme for this time. I was having a hard time with of the topics during these Sundays but when I was giving up the word Evangelization came to my mind! I think this is a great topic during this ordinary time to talk!

I was looking for a definition and I found this great definition from the USCCB document "Go and Make Disciples, this document states: "Evangelizing means bringing the Good News of Jesus into every human situation and seeking to convert individuals and society by the divine power of the Gospel itself. At its essence are the proclamation of salvation in Jesus Christ and the response of a person in faith, which are both works of the Spirit of God." You are going to hear a lot this definition during this time! I really want that you think about it and the most important act in this way that our Church is teaching us to follow. This document from our bishops in the number 10 and 11 is telling us that Evangelization must always be directly connected to the Lord Jesus Christ... Today in our reading we can see this connection! Our God is always attentive to our needs and God wants that we can see him in our journey in this life. We heard in our readings that these widows were in great need and desperation and Jesus the Good News can to help them. This document of our bishops continue saying that "There is no true evangelization if the name, the teaching, the life, the promises, the kingdom and the mystery of Jesus of Nazareth, the Son of God are not proclaimed." With this we can understand that "Evangelization is not a program. It is to bring people into a relationship with Jesus." This is what we are called to do and act during this time I will try to show you how every gospel is telling us the way to make real this wonderful call.

### Stewardship

**Q.** What is stewardship?

**A.** The concept of Stewardship is receiving God's gifts gratefully, cultivating them responsibly, and embracing a spiritual relationship with God. It is not a program, but a spiritual consciousness or way-of-life, based in Scripture, which holds that all we are and all we have flows from God's varied grace. In turn, we serve as spiritual caretakers of our worldly blessings.

**Q.** How can I become a better steward?

**A.** Stewardship is living a life of gratitude by the sharing of one's time, talent, and treasure and making daily decisions that glorify God. Give daily thanks for the blessings you have received from God, and ask yourself what you can do to help in your parish community. Being a good steward also means leading a generous, accountable way of life rooted in Christian discipleship.
