#### Thirty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time B November 18, 2018

**"And then they will see 'the Son of Man coming in the clouds'"**

Dear Friends in Christ, Happy Thanksgiving Day! This is the last Sunday in ordinary time of this liturgical year B. I hope this year you have grown in your relationship with Jesus. God has been so good with us because if we have to pay attention to God he has given us so many tools so that we can do his will.

In our bible study, Jeff Cavins and Sarah Christmyer have taught us about the interpretation of the Sacred Scripture. They are highlighting about the "three spiritual senses of Scripture. (1) Allegorical-the event's significance in Christ; (2) Moral-how the events show us we should live; and (3) anagogical- the eternal significance of the events in Scripture." When we apply these spiritual senses in the readings of this Sunday, we can learn a lot about God's plan for you and me. In this chapter of apocalyptic tone about the destruction of the temple and the coming of the Son of Man, is significant for Mark's Gospel, for it helps one see that God, in Jesus, will be victorious after the cross and at the end of history. When we think about the victory of Jesus over death and his promises for us to help us to be watchful every day.

In our first reading, we heard, "Many of those who sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake; some shall live forever, others shall be an everlasting horror and disgrace." In this reading it help us to understand the moral sense in this Sunday. How am I living? In what way, can I improve my daily actions so that I can live forever? And the second reading helps us to understand the allegorical sense of our Sunday's readings, "He has made perfect forever those who are being consecrated. Where there is forgiveness of these, there is no longer offering for sin." Jesus, our high priest, has conquered our salvation and this significant even gave us the security to be not afraid of the last judgment that every single people have to face.

In this Sunday Gospel, we heard how the author is telling us the anagogical sense and the eternal significance for us about the second coming of our Savior. "And then they will see 'the Son of Man coming in the clouds' with high power and glory, and then he will send out the angels and gather his elect from the four winds, from the end of the earth to the end of the sky." Now the questions, are you preparing for this moment? Do you understand how many chances God is giving us to be ready? Are you taking advantage of this time? God is so good that is giving us another chance in this Sunday to be watchful and prepared for his second coming.
